TRANSITION TOWN COMMUNITY GATHERING ~ . Transition Town will be the focus of Wisdom Circle on the 3rd Wednesday in August – August 18 at 7:30 p.m. Orillia as a Transition Town was the topic for the May gathering of Wisdom Circle at St. Paul's. After nine months gathering to explore a variety of topics of the "Awakening the Dreamer, Changing the Dream" Symposium – which has the goal to create a human presence on earth that is ecologically sustainable, spiritually fulfilling and socially just – people, including our local politicians, were invited to gather to explore bringing the Transition Town movement to Orillia.
